NEW TRUST TO RESTORE JUSTICE TO NAMATJIRA

This **Friday 3rd March at 11am**, a new trust will be launched in Canberra at the **National Museum of Australia** to honour one of Australia's most revered artists, Albert Namatjira, and restore justice to his family and community.

Albert Namatjira remains one of the most revered icons of Australia's art scene, and in 2012 alone, the national wholesale earnings for his works was over 10 million dollars. However, since 1983 the Namatjira family haven't earnt anything from copyright or royalties from reproductions of Albert Namatjira's works.

The Namatjira family are holders of some of the country's most significant heritage, something that was recognized in a remarkable private meeting with the Queen when Big hART's Namatjira theatre production toured to London in 2013. Yet despite all this, today the family face many challenges.

The Namatjira Legacy Trust will be launched at the National Museum of Australia on Friday 3 March by curator and writer **Hetti Perkins**, member of the Arrernte and Kalkadoon communities, and daughter of Charlie Perkins. Performing at the launch will be award-winning Indigenous singer-songwriter **Archie Roach** AM.

The Namatjira Legacy Trust is an initiative of the Namatjira family alongside **Big hART**, Australia's leading arts for social change company, and aims to restore justice by returning the copyright to Namatjira's descendants. By supporting the health, welfare, education and sustainability of their families and community in Hermannsburg, the Trust will ensure the remarkable traditions of the Western Desert watercolour movement thrive into the future.
